Jeffrey Brenner, M.D.

Dr. Jeffrey Brenner, M.D. is a healthcare and nonprofit leader focused on improving outcomes for vulnerable and complex populations. His career began as a frontline family physician in Camden, NJ. He founded the Camden Coalition of Healthcare Providers in 2002. Dr. Brenner's innovative use of data to identify high-need, high-cost patients and improve their care was profiled in the 2011 New Yorker article "The Hot Spotters" by writer and surgeon Dr. Atul Gawande, and on PBS Frontline. In 2013 he was honored with the MacArthur "Genius" Fellowship for his work, and in 2014 he was elected to the National Academy of Medicine. He currently serves as the CEO of a large mental health and social service agency in NYC called the Jewish Board of Family and Children's Services.
